All resolutions will be voted on by a poll.

1. SHAREHOLDERS

The Company has determined that for the purpose of voting at the Meeting, shares in the Company will be taken to be held by those persons recorded on the Company's register of shareholders at 7:00 pm AEDT (Sydney time) on 15 October 2024. This means that any Shareholder registered at 7:00 pm AEDT (Sydney time) on 15 October 2024 is entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting.

2. HOW TO VOTE

Appointment of Proxy

If you are a Shareholder, and you are unable to attend and vote at the Meeting, and wish to appoint a proxy, you can do so:

Votes on Resolutions

All of your shareholding will be voted in accordance with such a direction unless you indicate only a portion of voting rights are to be voted on each Resolution by inserting the percentage or number of Shares you wish to vote in the appropriate box or boxes. If you do not mark any of the boxes on the Resolution, your proxy may vote as he or she chooses. If you mark more than one box on a

Resolution, your vote will be invalid on that item of business.

How the Chairman will vote undirected proxies

At the date of this Notice of Meeting, the Chairman intends to vote all undirected proxies **FOR** the Resolutions set out in each of the items of business.

Unless amended, the Proxy Form expressly authorises the Chairman to exercise undirected proxies in his discretion in relation to all Resolutions even where such Resolutions are connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel (**KMP**), which includes the Chairman.

3. NON-BINDING RESOLUTION ON REMUNERATION REPORT

The Resolution for Item 2 is advisory and non-binding. The outcome of this Resolution does not bind the Company or the Directors. However, the Directors will consider the outcome of the vote and comments made by Shareholders on the Remuneration Report at the Meeting when reviewing the Company's remuneration policies.

If 25% or more of the votes that are cast are voted against adoption of the Remuneration Report at two consecutive AGMs, Shareholders will be required to vote at the second of those AGMs on a resolution (spill resolution) that another meeting of the Company's shareholders be held within 90 days at which all of the Company's Directors (other than the Managing Director) who were Directors of the Company when the Directors' Report for the second AGM was approved by those Directors, must stand for re-election.

A voting exclusion statement in respect of the Resolution for Item 2 is set out below.

4. VOTING EXCLUSION STATEMENTS

PART A

Item 2: Remuneration Report

A vote on the Resolution for Item 2 must not be cast (as a Shareholder, proxy or in any other capacity) by or on behalf of any of the following persons:

- 1) a member of the KMP details of whose remuneration is included in the Remuneration Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2024; or
- 2) a Closely Related Party of such a member of the KMP.

Notes

However, a vote may be cast by such person if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and:

- 1) the person is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- 2) the person appointed as proxy is the Chairman and the written appointment of the Chairman does not specify the way the Chairman is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chairman to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the KMP.

Item 7: Additional capacity to issue equity securities

The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution for Item 7 by or on behalf of the following persons:

- 1) a person who is expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of, the proposed issue, except a benefit solely by reason of being a holder of ordinary securities; or
- 2) an Associate of that person.

Note: under Listing Rule 14.11.1 and the notes under that rule about Listing Rule 7.1A, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting it is not known who may participate in the proposed issue (if any). On that basis, no security holders are currently excluded.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by those persons noted in Part B to this Note 4.

Item 8: Grant of rights to Peter Ludemann

The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution for Item 8 by or on behalf of the following persons:

- 1) Peter Ludemann (being a director of the Company or any other person referred to in Listing Rules 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 who is currently eligible to participate in the Plan); or
- 2) any Associate of Peter Ludemann.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by those persons noted in Part B to this Note 4.

In accordance with section 250BD of the Corporations Act, a vote on the Resolution for Item 8 must not be cast by a person appointed as a proxy, where that person is either a member of the KMP or a Closely Related Party of such member.

However, a vote may be cast by such person if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and:

- 1) the person is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- 2) the person appointed as proxy is the Chairman and the written appointment of the Chairman does not specify the way the Chairman is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chairman to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the KMP.

Item 9: Grant of rights to Christopher Hummer

The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution for Item 9 by or on behalf of the following persons:

- 1) Christopher Hummer (being a director of the Company or any other person referred to in Listing Rules 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 who is currently eligible to participate in the Plan); or
- 2) any Associate of Christopher Hummer.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by those persons noted in Part B to this Note 4.

In accordance with section 250BD of the Corporations Act, a vote on the Resolution for Item 9 must not be cast by a person appointed as a proxy, where that person is either a member of the KMP or a Closely Related Party of such member.

Notes

However, a vote may be cast by such person if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and:

- 1) the person is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- 2) the person appointed as proxy is the Chairman and the written appointment of the Chairman does not specify the way the Chairman is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chairman to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the KMP.

PART B

For the purposes of the voting exclusion statements for Items 7, 8 and 9, the Company will not disregard votes cast in favour of the Resolutions by:

- 1) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way; or
- 2) the Chairman of the Meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chairman to vote on the Resolution as the Chairman decides; or a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Explanatory Memorandum

This Explanatory Memorandum and the other attachments to the Notice of Annual General Meeting (Notice) which it accompanies are important documents. Please read them carefully.

ITEM 1 – FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

The Corporations Act requires that the report of the Directors, the report of the auditors and the financial reports be presented to the Annual General Meeting. In addition, the Company's Constitution provides for such reports and statements to be received and considered at the Meeting.

The Company's 2024 Annual Report is available on the Company's website (<https://ntawholdings.com.au/investors-asx-announcements/annual-reports>) and has been sent to those Shareholders who have requested a copy.

ITEM 2 – REMUNERATION REPORT

Introduction

The Corporations Act requires that the section of the Directors' Report dealing with the remuneration of the Directors and other Key Management Personnel (**Remuneration Report**) be put to the members for adoption by way of a non-binding vote.

The Remuneration Report can be found in the Company's 2024 Annual Report.

Shareholders will be given a reasonable opportunity to ask questions about, or make comments upon, the Remuneration Report during the Meeting.

Directors' recommendation

The Board unanimously recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution for Item 2.

ITEM 3 – RE-ELECTION OF MURRAY BOYTE AS A DIRECTOR

Introduction

The Listing Rules and the Company's constitution prescribe a process by which Directors regularly retire from office. Retiring Directors may offer themselves for election or re-election.

Pursuant to Listing Rule 14.5 and rule 8.1(g) of the constitution of the Company, Mr Murray Boyte retires at the conclusion of the Meeting, and being eligible, offers himself for re-election as an Independent Non-Executive Director of the Company.

Explanatory Memorandum

A summary of Mr Boyte's qualifications and experience appears below:

Mr Boyte has over 35 years' experience in merchant banking and finance, undertaking company reconstructions, mergers and acquisitions in Australia, New Zealand, North America and Hong Kong. In addition, he has held executive positions and Directorships in the transport, horticultural, financial services, investment, health services and property industries. Mr Boyte is currently a member of the Company's Remuneration and Nominations Committee and Audit and Risk Committee. Mr Boyte is currently the Non-Executive Chairman of Eureka Group Holdings Limited (ASX: EGH); a Non-Executive Director of Hillgrove Resources Limited (ASX: HGO); and a Non-Executive Director of Eumundi Group Limited (ASX: EBG).

Directors' recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Boyte in relation to his own election) unanimously recommends that the Shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution for Item 3.

ITEM 4 – ELECTION OF CHRISTOPHER HUMMER AS A DIRECTOR

Introduction

The Listing Rules and the Company's constitution prescribe a process by which Directors who have been appointed by the Directors as an addition to the Board, retire at the conclusion of the Meeting, and being eligible, offer themselves for election as a Director of the Company.

Pursuant to Listing Rule 14.4 and rule 8.1(e) and rule 8.1(g) of the constitution of the Company, Mr Christopher Hummer retires at the conclusion of the Meeting, and being eligible, offers himself for election as an Executive Director of the Company.

A summary of Mr Hummer's qualifications and experience appears below:

Mr Hummer is an experienced company director for 35 years who started his career building a business providing 24 hour emergency roadside repairs under contract to Royal Automobile Club in Victoria. Mr Hummer has held directorships in building / construction, Automotive and Industry Associations. Mr Hummer worked with DMIB Berhad Malaysia to launch a range of offroad racing tyres to global markets before creating Dynamic Wheel Co. ("DWC") in 1998. He has been responsible for growing DWC into a national wheel wholesaler since its part-acquisition by NTAW Holdings in 2013 before full acquisition in 2017 and supporting the international expansion of DWC wheel brands both in NTAW's New Zealand and South African entities. Mr Hummer was elected President (Chair) of the Victorian Automotive Chamber of Commerce in 2022 and is also President of The Australian Tyre Dealers and Retread Association. Mr Hummer is a member of the Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry Council.

Directors' recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Hummer in relation to his own election) unanimously recommends that the Shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution for Item 4.

ITEM 5 – ELECTION OF KENNETH GUNDERSON-BRIGGS AS A DIRECTOR

Introduction

The Listing Rules and the Company's constitution prescribe a process by which Directors who have been appointed by the Directors as an addition to the Board, retire at the conclusion of the Meeting, and being eligible, offer themselves for election as a Director of the Company.

Pursuant to Listing Rule 14.4 and rule 8.1(e) and rule 8.1(g) of the constitution of the Company, Mr Kenneth Gunderson-Briggs retires at the conclusion of the Meeting, and being eligible, offers himself for election as an Independent Non-Executive Director of the Company.

A summary of Mr Gunderson-Briggs' qualifications and experience appears below:

Mr Gunderson-Briggs is a chartered accountant and a registered company auditor, being a partner in a chartered accounting firm since 1990. Mr Gunderson-Briggs joined the Board of Harvey Norman Holdings Limited in 2003 where he has been the Chair of the Remuneration Committee since 2015 and Chair of the Audit & Risk and Nomination Committees since 2020. Mr Gunderson-Briggs was a Director of Australian Pharmaceutical Industries Limited from 2014 to 2022, being appointed as Chair of the Board in 2020 (up until the takeover of API by Wesfarmers Limited in 2020). Mr Gunderson-Briggs is the Chairman of the Company's Audit & Risk Committee and the Company's Remuneration & Nominations Committee.

Directors' recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Gunderson-Briggs in relation to his own election) unanimously recommends that the Shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution for Item 5.

ITEM 6 – ELECTION OF TYNAN YOUNG AS A DIRECTOR

Introduction

The Listing Rules and the Company's constitution prescribe a process by which Directors who have been appointed by the Directors as an addition to the Board, retire at the conclusion of the Meeting, and being eligible, offer themselves for election as a Director of the Company.

Pursuant to Listing Rule 14.4 and rule 8.1(e) and rule 8.1(g) of the constitution of the Company, Mr Tynan Young retires at the conclusion of the Meeting, and being eligible, offers himself for election as an Independent Non-Executive Director of the Company.

A summary of Mr Young's qualifications and experience appears below:

Mr Young has had a successful career within the technology sector, working in the media, finance and technology industries. Mr Young currently holds a technology leadership role at a leading data and research-driven trading business. Mr Young was previously the Global Head of Network and Data Centre at The Trade Desk (NASDAQ: TTD). Mr Young is a member of the Company's Audit & Risk Committee.

Explanatory Memorandum

Directors' recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Young in relation to his own election) unanimously recommends that the Shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution for Item 6.

ITEM 7 – ADDITIONAL CAPACITY TO ISSUE EQUITY SECURITIES

Introduction

Listing Rule 7.1A enables small to mid-cap listed companies to seek Shareholder approval by special resolution to issue equity securities equivalent to an additional 10% of the number of ordinary securities on issue by way of placement over a 12 month period (**10% Placement Facility**), without a need for further Shareholder approval. This is in addition to the existing 15% placement capacity permitted by Listing Rule 7.1.

A company is eligible to seek Shareholder approval for this additional placement capacity if it satisfies both of the following criteria at the date of the AGM:

- (a) it has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less; and
- (b) it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index.

The Company currently satisfies both the above criteria, and it is anticipated that it will satisfy both these criteria at the date of the AGM.

Accordingly, Item 7 is seeking Shareholder approval by special resolution for the issue of such number of equity securities as calculated under the formula in Listing Rule 7.1A.2, at an issue price as permitted by Listing Rule 7.1A.3 (as set out below) to such persons as the Board may determine, on the terms as described in this Explanatory Memorandum.

If the Resolution in Item 7 is approved, the Company will be able to issue equity securities under Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without further shareholder approval such that the Company's total annual placement capacity will be 25% of its issued capital.

If the Resolution in Item 7 is not approved, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue equity securities without shareholder approval provided for in Listing Rule 7.1 and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing equity securities without shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

At the date of the Meeting, it is anticipated that the Company will have on issue 134,136,094 Shares and a capacity to issue 20,120,414 Shares under Listing Rule 7.1 and, if the Resolution in Item 7 is approved, a capacity to issue an additional 13,413,609 Shares under Listing Rule 7.1A.

The actual number of equity securities that the Company will have capacity to issue under Listing Rule 7.1A will be calculated at the date of issue of the equity securities in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2.

Explanatory Memorandum

The effect of Item 7 will be to allow the Directors to issue equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A, in addition to the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1, from the date of the AGM at which approval of the 10% Placement Facility under Listing Rule 7.1A is obtained until the first to occur of the following:

- (a) the date that is 12 months after the date of the AGM i.e. 17 October 2025;
- (b) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; or
- (c) the date of the approval by Shareholders of a transaction under Listing Rules 11.1.2 (a significant change to the nature or scale of activities) or 11.2 (disposal of main undertaking),
(10% Placement Period).

Information required by Listing Rule 7.3A

For the purposes of Listing Rule 7.3A, the following information is provided:

- The period for which the approval will be valid is the 10% Placement Period.
- The minimum price at which the equity securities will be issued will be no less than 75% of the volume weighted average market price for ordinary shares calculated over the 15 trading days on which trades are recorded immediately before:
 - (a) the date on which the price at which the shares are to be issued is agreed by the entity and the recipient of the securities; or
 - (b) if the shares are not issued within 10 trading days of the date in paragraph (a), the date on which the shares are issued.

Note: Securities can only be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 for cash consideration.

- The Company intends to use any funds raised by an issue of equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 towards an acquisition of new assets or investments (including expenses associated with such acquisition), continued development of, or investment in, the Company's current assets, general working capital and/or other capital management purposes.
- If the Resolution in Item 7 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues equity securities under the 10% Placement Facility, the existing ordinary Shareholders face the risk of economic and voting dilution as a result of the issue of equity securities which are the subject of this Resolution, to the extent that such equity securities are issued, including:
 - (a) the market price of equity securities may be significantly lower on the issue date than on the date on which this approval is being sought; and
 - (b) the equity securities may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for those equity securities on the issue date,

which may also have an effect on the amount of funds raised by the issue of the equity securities.

- The following table gives examples of the potential dilution of existing ordinary Shareholders on the basis of the market price of Shares at 15 August 2024 and the number of ordinary securities for variable "A", calculated in accordance with the formula in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 as at the date of this Notice (and on the assumption that the Resolutions being considered at the Meeting are approved).

Explanatory Memorandum

The table also shows:

- (a) two examples where variable “A” has increased by 50% and 100%. Variable “A” is based on the number of fully paid ordinary securities the Company has on issue. The number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue may increase as a result of issues of ordinary securities that do not require Shareholder approval (for example, a pro rata entitlements issue or scrip issued under a takeover offer) or future specific placements under Listing Rule 7.1 that are approved at a future Shareholders’ meeting; and
- (b) two examples of where the issue price of fully paid ordinary securities has decreased by 50% and increased by 100% as against the current market price.

- (a) the methods of raising funds available to the Company (including but not limited to, rights issue or other issues in which existing security holders can participate), while balancing interest from potential allottees with the interests of existing Shareholders;
 - (b) the effect of the issue of equity securities on the control of the Company. Allocation will be subject to takeover thresholds;
 - (c) the financial situation and solvency of the Company and its need for capital at any given time; and
 - (d) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisors (if applicable).
- The Company has not issued or agreed to issue any equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the 12 months preceding the date of the Meeting. Further, there are no equity securities that the Company agreed before that 12 month period to issue but which have not yet been issued.
 - At the time of dispatching this Notice of Meeting, the Company is not proposing to make an issue of equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2.

The Resolution for Item 7 is a special resolution. For a special resolution to be passed, at least 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and entitled to vote on the Resolution must be in favour of the Resolution.

A voting exclusion statement in relation to the Resolution for Item 7 is set out under Note 4 in the Notice of Meeting.

Directors' recommendation

The Directors unanimously recommend Shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution for Item 7 as it will provide additional flexibility for the Company to secure additional capital quickly if Directors decide that it is in the best interests of the Company.

ITEM 8 – GRANT OF RIGHTS TO PETER LUDEMANN

Introduction

The Resolution in Item 8 seeks Shareholder approval for the grant of 500,000 Rights to the Managing Director and CEO, Peter Ludemann, under the Company's Employee Equity Plan (**Plan**), subject to the terms and conditions of his 2025 LTI Award (**Rights**).

If shareholder approval is not obtained under the Resolution in Item 8, the Rights will not be issued to Mr Ludemann and, subject to satisfaction of the Performance Conditions and other conditions described below, Mr Ludemann will receive a cash payment at the end of the three-year Performance Period equivalent to the value of the Rights on that date.

Why Shareholder approval is being sought

Shareholder approval of the Resolution in Item 8 is being sought for the following purposes, as explained in greater detail below:

- Listing Rule 10.14;
- Part 2D.2 of the Corporations Act (termination benefits); and
- Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act (financial benefits to related parties).

Explanatory Memorandum

Listing Rule 10.14

Listing Rule 10.14 states that a listed company must not permit a Director (amongst other persons) to acquire securities under an employee incentive scheme without Shareholder approval given by ordinary resolution.  - A short term incentive (**STI**) with a maximum opportunity of 50% of TFR (at maximum performance levels); and
 - A long term incentive (**LTI**) in the form of Rights which will be issued under the Plan and will be subject to performance conditions as determined by the Board to support the long-term growth of the Company. The number of Rights to be awarded will be determined by the Board having regard to the overall amount of executive remuneration and the annual profit impact of the Rights awarded.

The average acquisition price (if any) paid by Mr Ludemann for those Options was \$Nil.

Appendix A

The material terms of the Rights discussed in Item 8 and Item 9 above are summarised below:

The Board has determined that, for the year ending 30 June 2025, up to 2,750,000 Rights (in total) will be issued to senior executives, including the 500,000 Rights to be issued to Mr Ludemann and 200,000 Rights to be issued to Mr Hummer (collectively referred to as **the Executive Directors**). The remaining Rights will be allocated to other senior executives based on their roles and responsibilities.

Conditions and Important Dates for the Rights

The Vesting Date of the Rights will be 30 September 2027, or three years from the Grant Date, whichever is earlier, subject to meeting the Performance Conditions. The Performance Period for the Performance Conditions is the period from the Grant Date until the Vesting Date (inclusive of each of those dates).

The Rights will expire on 30 September 2029, being the date which is two years after the Vesting Date, if not lapsed earlier.

Performance Conditions

Vesting of the Rights is dependent on, and subject to, satisfaction of the following Performance Conditions:

- i. Total Shareholder Return condition (applicable to 50% of the Rights) – the Compound Annual Growth Rate (**CAGR**) in the Company's Total Shareholder Return (**TSR**) will be tested on the Vesting Date and the Rights will vest in accordance with the following TSR CAGR hurdles:

At least 10% but less than 15% p.a.	35% to 50% on a straight-line basis

TSR CAGR means the TSR compound annual growth rate as against the Base VWAP.

TSR means the total shareholder return to a shareholder of the Company, inclusive of Share Price Appreciation, capital returns and dividends.

Share Price Appreciation means the difference between the Base VWAP and Vesting VWAP.

Base VWAP means the volume weighted average price of Shares over the 10 Trading Days (as that term is defined in the Listing Rules) immediately before and 10 Trading Days immediately after the release of the Company's 2024 financial report. The 2024 financial report was released on 28 August 2024 and the Base VWAP could not be calculated at the time of this Notice of Meeting.

Vesting VWAP means the volume weighted average price of Shares over the 10 Trading Days (as that term is defined in the Listing Rules) immediately before and 10 Trading Days immediately after the release of the Company's 2027 financial report, expected to be on or about 31 August 2027.

- ii. Return on Net Assets condition (applicable to the other 50% of the Rights) – the Return on Net Assets (**RONA**) will be tested on the Vesting Date and the Rights will vest in accordance with the following RONA hurdles:

RONA means the return on net assets, being the Aggregate APBT as a percentage of the Aggregate Net Assets.

Aggregate APBT means the aggregate of the amounts of the annual net profit before income tax of the Company for each of the Financial Years, adjusted for the effect of AASB 16 *Leases*.

Aggregate Net Assets means the aggregate of the amounts of the net assets of the Company, excluding non-controlling interests, as at each of 30 June 2024, 30 June 2025, and 30 June 2026 as disclosed in the Company's annual report, adjusted for the effect of AASB 16 *Leases*.

Financial Years means the financial years ending 30 June 2025, 30 June 2026, and 30 June 2027.

- iii. Service condition – continuous employment of the Executive Directors with the Company or one of its subsidiaries from the Grant Date until the Vesting Date.

If the Performance Conditions are not met before the end of the Performance Period, the Rights will lapse. The TSR condition and RONA condition are independent of each other.

Lapsing and early vesting of the Rights

Change of Control Event: On a takeover or change in control of the Company any unvested Rights will immediately vest and cease to be subject to any Performance Condition.

Termination of employment: If the Executive Directors cease employment before the Performance Conditions are satisfied the Rights will automatically lapse 30 days after that employment ceases, unless the Board determines otherwise in accordance with the Plan. If the Executive Directors cease to be employed by the Company by reason of death, disability, bona fide redundancy or other reason with the approval of the Board, the Board has a discretion to determine that some or all of the Rights do not lapse but are deemed to have vested.

If the Executive Directors' employment is terminated on the basis that the Executive Directors have acted fraudulently, dishonestly, in breach of their obligations or otherwise for cause, all of the Rights (including those which have not yet vested and those which have vested but are unexercised) will immediately lapse.

Other Information

- The Company will not apply to the ASX for official quotation of the Rights granted under the Plan.
- Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the Rights will rank equally with Shares then on issue.
- Any dealing in Shares is subject to the constraints of Australian insider trading laws and the Company's Securities Trading policy.

Appendix B

Additional information is provided explaining why Shareholder approval of the Resolutions in Item 8 and Item 9 is being sought.

Part 2D.2 of the Corporations Act: Termination Benefits

Under section 200B of the Corporations Act, a company may only give a person a benefit in connection with their ceasing to hold a managerial or executive office in the company or a related body corporate if it is approved by shareholders or an exemption applies. Further, under section 200C of the Corporations Act, a company may only give a person a benefit in connection with the transfer of the whole or any part of the undertaking or property of the company if it is approved by shareholders.

The term “benefit” in Part 2D.2 has wide operation and would include the accelerated vesting of Rights.

Accordingly, Shareholder approval is sought under section 200E of the Corporations Act for the:

- giving of termination benefits to the Executive Directors in accordance with the Plan or their employment contracts if the Executive Directors cease to be employed by the Company and, as a result of the Board exercising its discretion, some or all of the Executive Directors’ Rights vest; and
- giving of benefits to the Executive Directors if the Executive Directors’ Rights automatically vest as a result of a Change in Control Event being triggered due to the transfer of an undertaking or property of the Company.

As at the date of this Notice the estimated value of the Rights to be issued to Mr Ludemann and Mr Hummer is \$177,000 and \$71,000, respectively. However, the value of the benefits at the time they may be given cannot presently be ascertained. The matters, events and circumstances that will, or are likely to, affect the calculation of that value include:

- the number of Rights held by the Executive Directors prior to cessation of employment or at the time of the Change of Control Event; and
- the market price of Shares at that time.

If Shareholder approval is obtained and the Rights automatically vest as a result of a Change in Control Event or the Board exercises its discretion to vest some or all of the Executive Directors’ unvested Rights, the value of the benefit will be disregarded when calculating his termination benefit ‘cap’ as permitted by the Corporations Act.

Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

For a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- obtain the approval of the public company’s shareholders in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- give the benefit within 15 months following such approval, unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

Appendix B

One of the exceptions where shareholder approval is not needed is where the financial benefit is (relevantly) remuneration to a related party as an officer or employee of the public company or an entity that the public company controls and to give the benefit would be reasonable given the circumstances of the public company or entity giving the remuneration and the related party's circumstances (including the responsibilities involved in the office of employment). This "reasonable remuneration" exception is contained in section 211 of the Corporations Act.

The grant of the Rights to Mr Ludemann and Mr Hummer will constitute the giving of a financial benefit and Mr Ludemann and Mr Hummer are related parties of the Company by virtue of being a Director of the Company.
